SECTION ONE: Priorities

Non-Contestable Regional Partnership Fund

Subsequent to community consultation and submissions the following projected initiatives and concepts will be funded through the Non-Contestable Regional Partnership Fund.

| 1 | Skill Development | Fundamental Skills Programme - This pilot programme will focus on developing and enhancing key Aquatics, Movement and Manipulative fundamental skills for yr 2- yr 6 primary school children. | | |

| 5 | Strengthening Connections | Pathway for School Leavers - Improve transition and pathways from secondary school to club through sport. This initiative centers on teenagers having a continued involvement in sport once they transition or leave the education setting. To be piloted in Upper Hutt (pending investment directly from SPARC, if investment is granted then KiwiSport will invest in evaluation and possible regional roll-out as well as transition and pathways from intermediate to college). | | |
| | | Strengthening Secondary School Partnerships with Sport - This initiative aims to strengthen partnerships between Secondary Schools and Regional Sports Organisations. Based on initial feedback, Table Tennis and Bowls have been identified initially to further enhance their growing popularity among secondary school students and provide opportunities for other who not normally participate in organized sport. | | |

Contestable Regional Partnership Fund

The following initiatives and concepts are likely to be funded within Priority 4, Sport Development in Communities through the Contestable Regional Partnership Fund.

- **Have a Go@SPORT** - projects that provide school-aged children the opportunity to participate and experience a given sport for a period of lessons either before, during or after school.
- **Have a Go@FUN-damentals** - multiple sports/codes working collaboratively to provide sport-related fundamental skills and experiences before, during or after school. (e.g. striking skills/technique - tennis, table tennis, squash, softball, cricket and hockey)
- **Traditional and Cultural Sport** - initiatives that provide schools and communities the opportunity to participate and experience a variety of traditional and cultural sports such as Waka Ama, Kirikiti and Ki-o-rahi will be deferred to 2010/11 and/or 2011/12.

SECTION TWO: Requirements and Considerations

The following criteria will be used to determine applicants' eligibility for funding. A successful application will be based on how well a proposal meets all or some of the requirements and considerations.

| Requirements | Explanation |
|----------------------------|--|
| Partnerships | Partnerships between clusters of schools, clubs, communities or sport providers |
| Strategic or Business Plan | Applicants will be required to show their organisation has a basic strategic or business plan for the length of the project |
| Financial Contribution | Refer to Section Four - Partner Contribution |
| Impact | Applicants will be required to illustrate how their project stimulates or influences school-aged children NOT participating in organised sport. |

| Considerations | Explanation |
|--------------------------------|--|
| Regional & National Alignment | Projects that are aligned with their regional & national associations' strategic outcomes |
| Opportunities for All | Projects that consider issues such as disability, social and economic inequalities |
| Professional Development | Projects that provide aspects of coach, volunteer, student or teacher development |
| Information | Projects that address issues surrounding concerns that families and schools are unaware of opportunities |
| Facilities | Projects that address facilities as a barrier to participation and take part in underutilised assets |
| Reduce Transportation Barriers | Projects that address transport costs and issues related to rural and non-rural communities |

SECTION THREE: 2009/10 Fund Allocation (\$657,807 - yr 1 only)

The proportion of allocated funding for 2009/10 will be 80% non-contestable and 20% contestable (see table below).

This decision was made for the following reasons:

- Predominance of support for non-contestable vs. contestable ratio
- Less bureaucracy and 'form-filling' if more funds are non-contestable
- Non-contestable allocation allows for targeted and more strategic proposals/projects to be funded from a variety of partners
- Contestable ratio still allows communities the opportunity to take responsibility for their own ideas
- Contestable allocation perceived as a fairer method for some in the community

Sport Wellington has ruled out ring-fencing monies targeting age groups and geographical areas. Sport Wellington would prefer to fund proposals/projects over a three year time frame (where possible) to ensure a level of security for the project and to enable a real difference to be made and evaluated.
